PROGRAM GUIDELINES

You must complete a total of 80 units for the program.

Students cannot complete the Music Major or the Popular Music and Technology major in the BA component of the dual degree.

Bachelor of Music (Honours) Requirements:

- ❖ 48 units from the BMus (Hons) List, comprising:
 - 26 units for Part A; and
 - 12 units from Part B; and
 - 10 units from Part C.

Bachelor of Arts Requirements:

- ❖ 32 units from Part A and Part B of the BA List, including comprising:
 - Two majors of 16 units each; or
 - One extended major of 24 units (28 units Psychology) plus the balance in electives from the BA course list; or
 - One major of 16 units and two minors of 8 units each (a minor consists of 8 units chosen from one major list, which must include one gateway course and one cornerstone course, with a maximum of 4 units at introductory level).
