

Bachelor of Music (Honours)

UQ's Bachelor of Music (Honours) is intended for students wishing to pursue a professional career in music. It integrates the development of practical skills with theoretical and historical musical knowledge, culminating in advanced research training in the student's chosen Music Honours field.

Students can pursue studies across the areas of Composition, Music Learning, Performance, Musicology, Popular Music and Technology, and Music Psychology. There are also opportunities to participate in the Queensland Symphony Orchestra

Internship program and the UQ Study Abroad program.

Studying music at UQ

The School of Music creates leaders in music performance, composition, education and research. Our courses are inspiring and are delivered by nationally and internationally acclaimed music professionals. The UQ Bachelor of Music (Honours) gives you the opportunity to enhance your practical skills through master classes, student

performances and QPAC concerts.

All students complete two years of practical studies including weekly lessons, chamber and ensemble participation, performance practice and recitals. Those who continue on to advanced study in performance complete four years in total.

What you study

As a student in UQ's Bachelor of Music (Honours) you will complete core courses in music techniques, aural skills, music history and practical studies in your chosen instrument.

You then select one or more fields of advanced study (based upon your professional interests and academic strengths), culminating in your final year Honours research project.

The UQ Bachelor of Music (Honours) can be combined with the following undergraduate degrees: Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science and the Bachelor of Education (Secondary).
